

The artist Luã Linhares, from Belo Horizonte - Brazil, has just released his first solo single, titled "Heart," a direct and energetic rock track that reflects influences from bands like Foo Fighters, Muse, and Shaman. According to the artist, the song addresses the importance of listening to one's own heart. The track is now available on digital platforms, and the music video can be watched on YouTube.

The production of "Heart" is handled by Luã himself, who has a track record of work recognized and shared by personalities such as Madonna, drummer Eloy Casagrande (Slipknot), Kiko Loureiro (Angra, ex-Megadeth), and the band Blind Guardian. Recently, the single "Beatific" by American singer Cris Gunther, produced by Luã, was nominated for the Hollywood Independent Music Awards in the Rock Pop category. Another highlight was "Breaking Curses (Club Remix)," co-produced by Luã and DJ Bashar, which reached number 1 on the iTunes Dance Albums chart in February this year.

With over 20 years of experience in music as a singer, multi-instrumentalist, and producer, Luã Linhares has been a part of bands such as Suspense Band, Nem Secos, and Kortza, and has collaborated with renowned artists like Max Viana, Mexican singer Zaira Franco, and members of Clube da Esquina. He is currently a member of the alternative metal band The Vour. And in 2024 he decided to also start a solo career project using his own name.

In addition to his music productions, Luã also streams on TikTok, reaching thousands of people worldwide with his musical live sessions. "Heart" is the first of a series of releases marking this new phase in Luã Linhares' career. The single is available on digital streaming platforms, and the official music video has also been released on YouTube.
